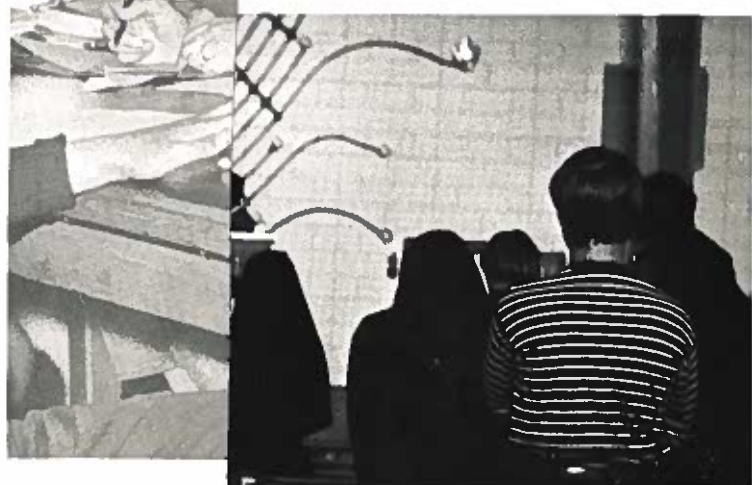
# TEACHER-AIDES

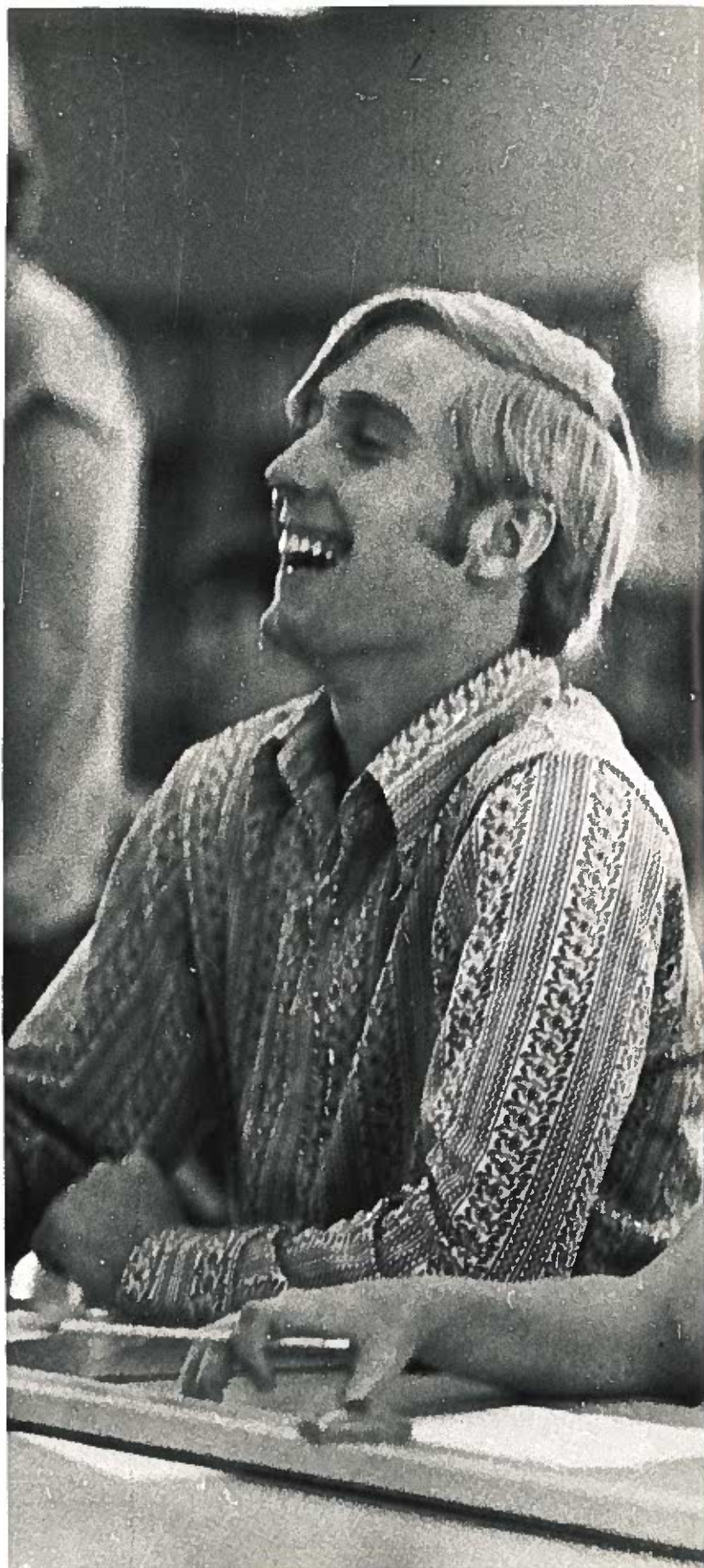

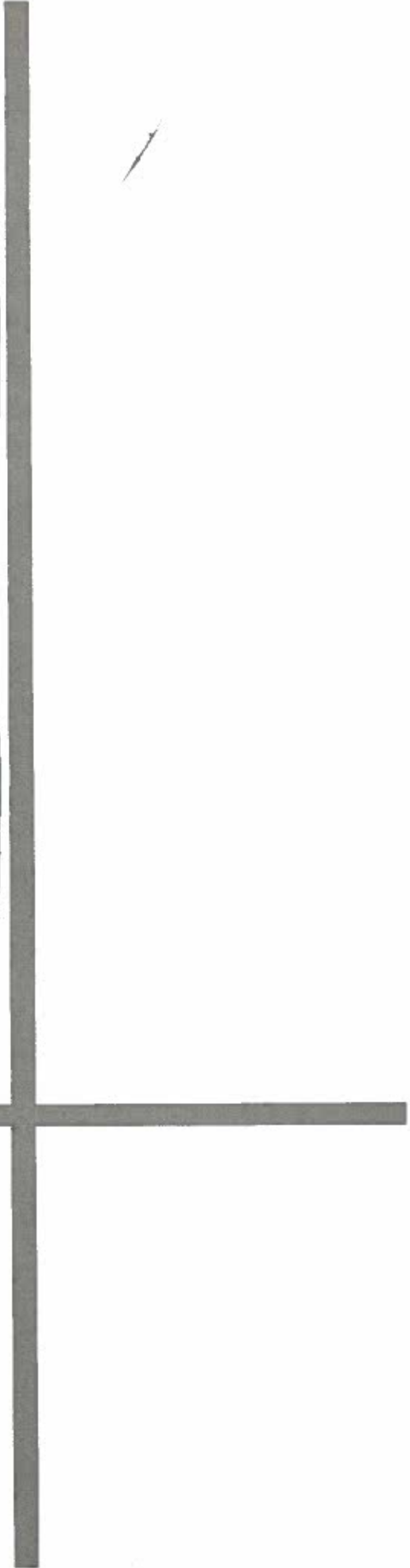
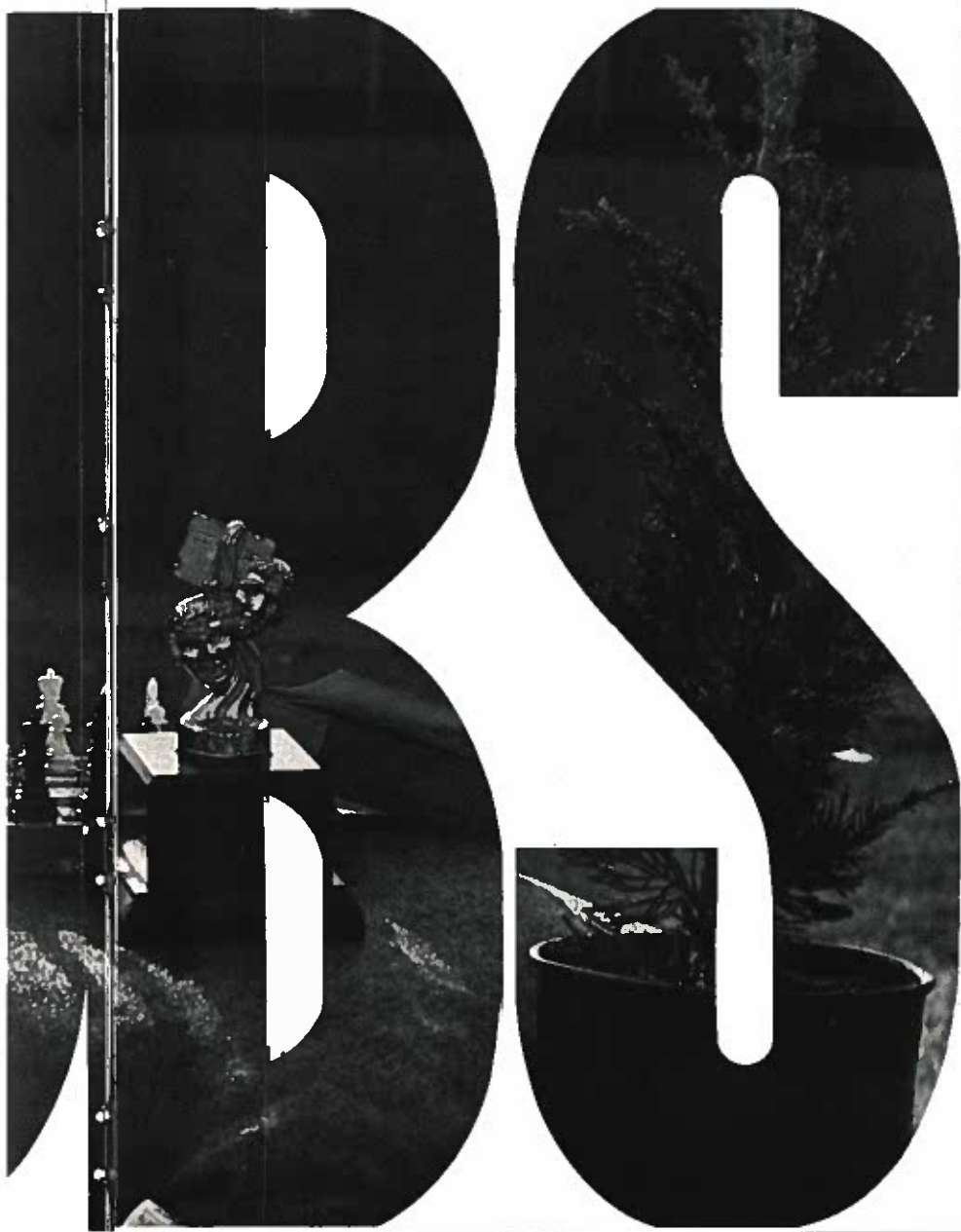


It is surprising to meet a group of "politicians" who keep their campaign promises once they are elected. Together and always busy, the six member team worked to organize all student activities at Marian.

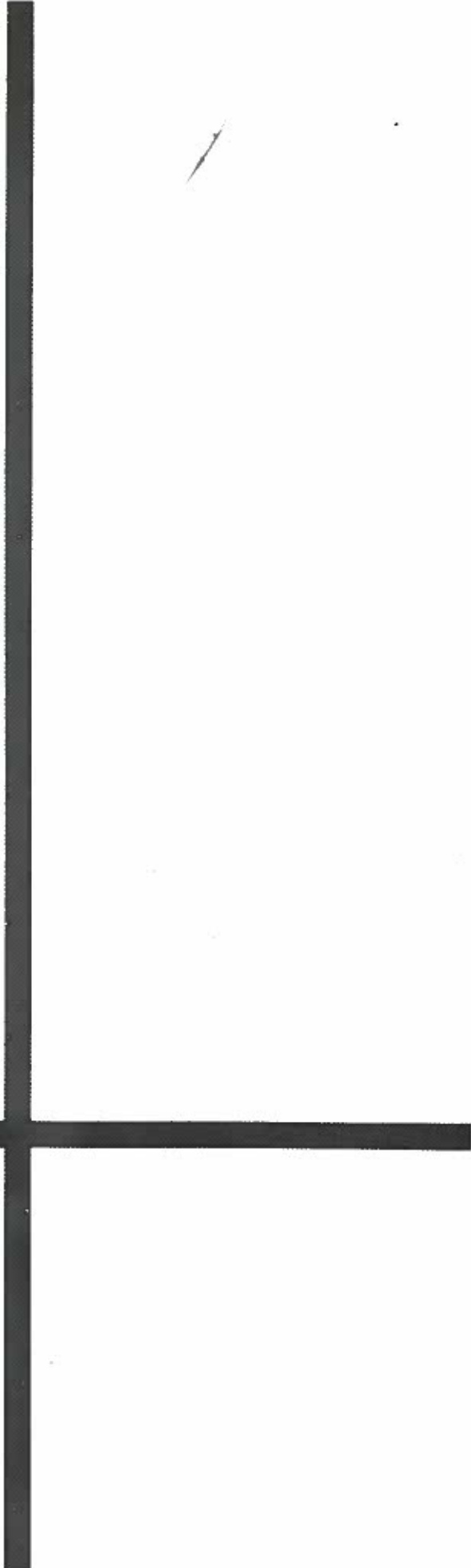
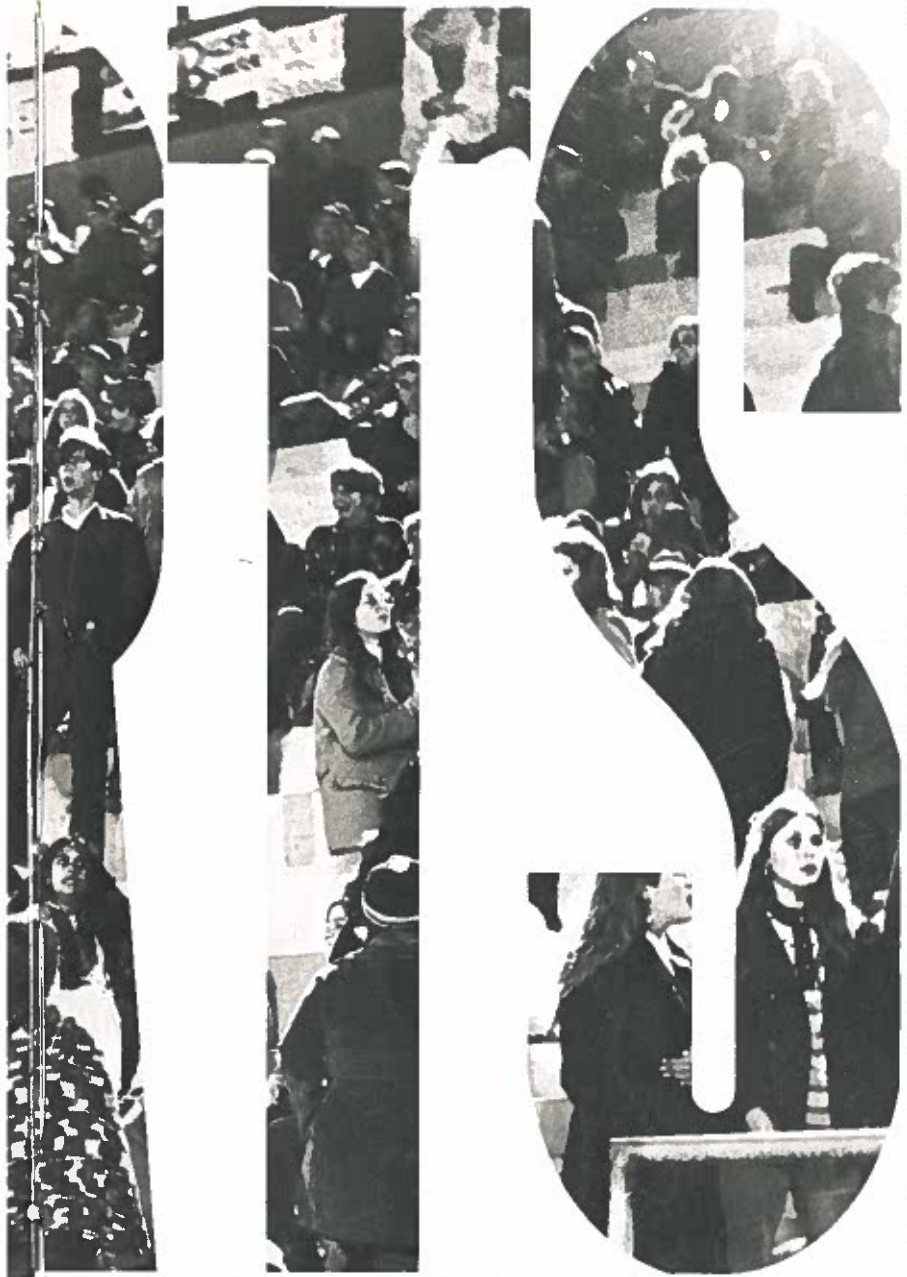

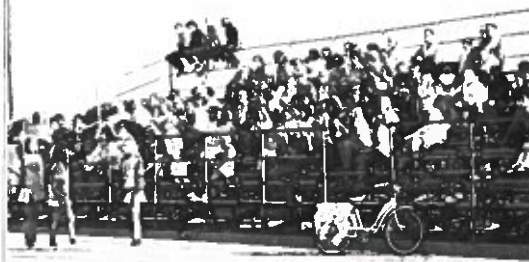
# JUNIOR VARSITY

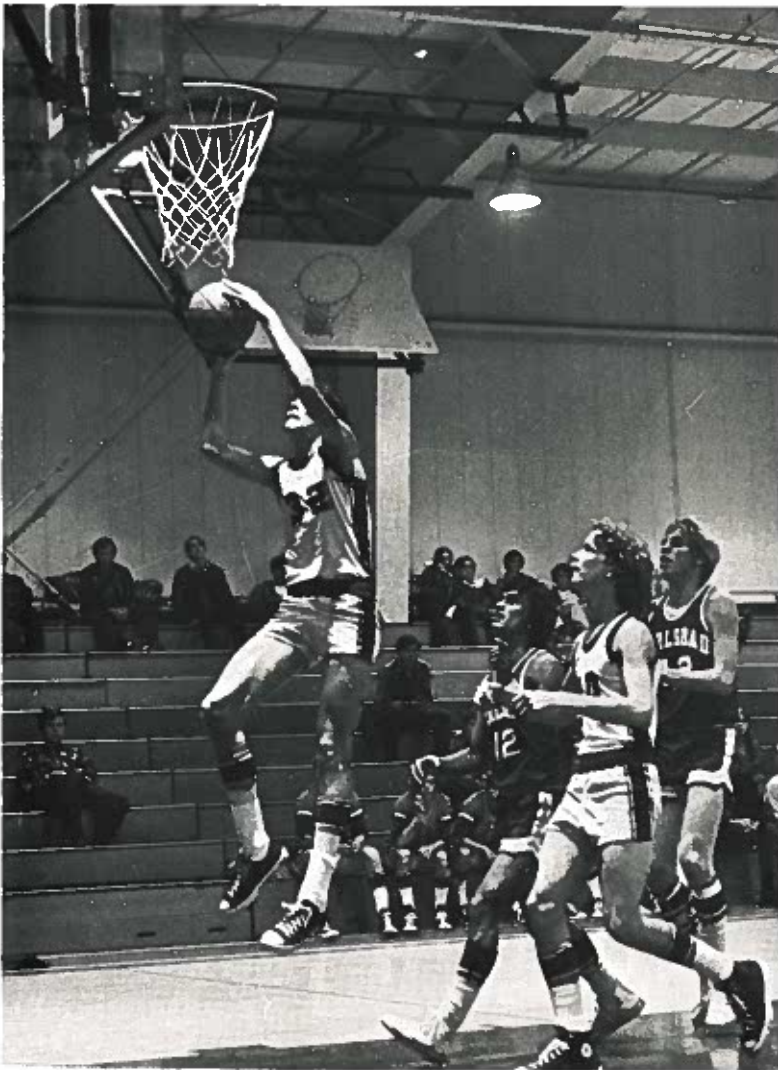




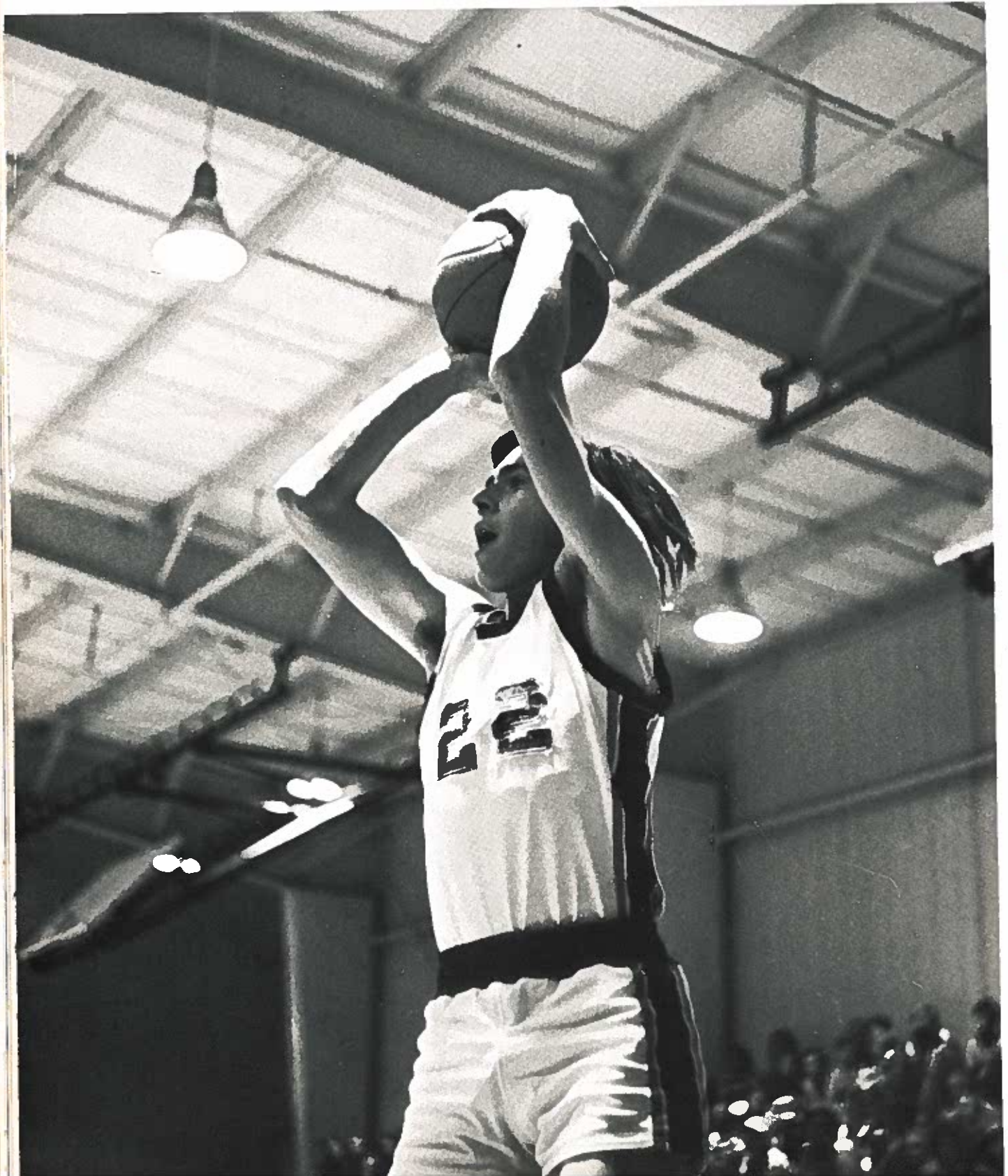

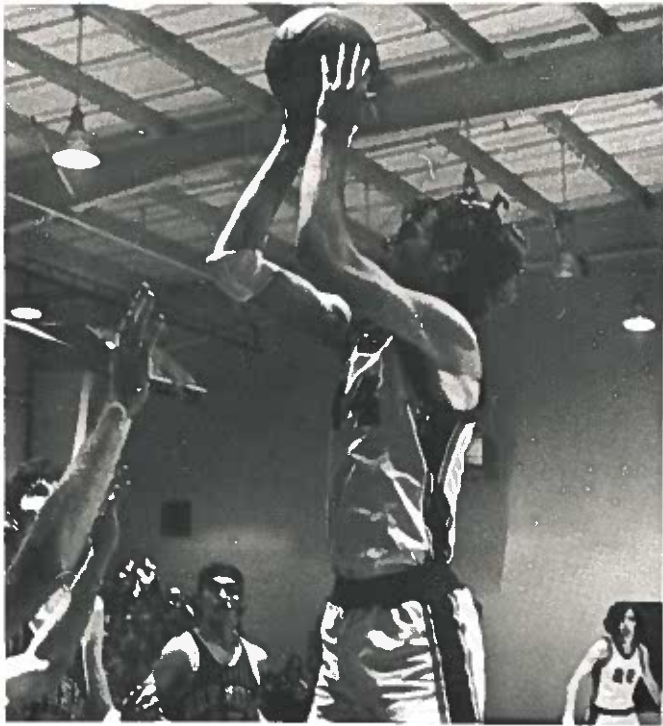
# WINTER SEASON SPORTS

# SOCCER TEAM

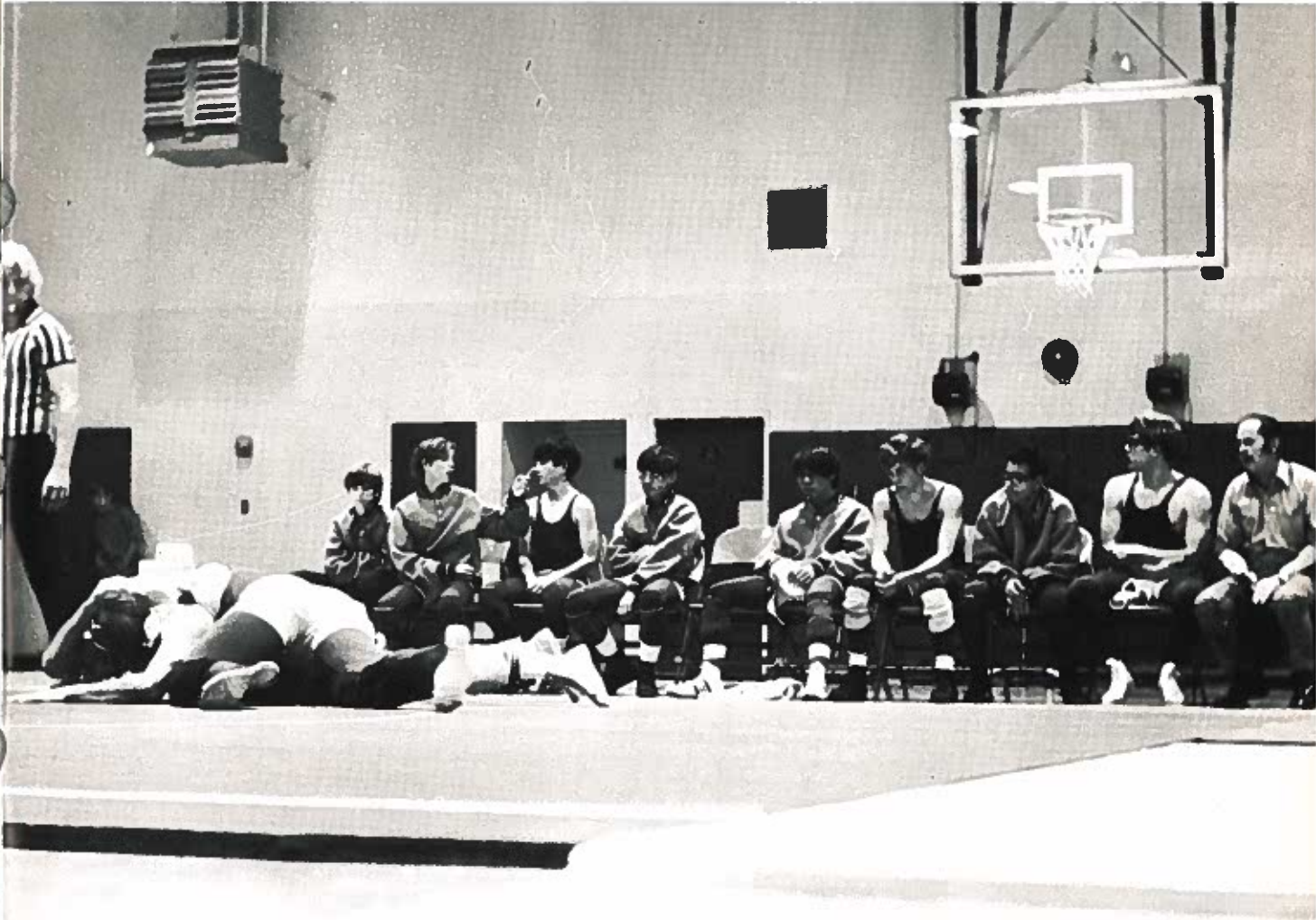

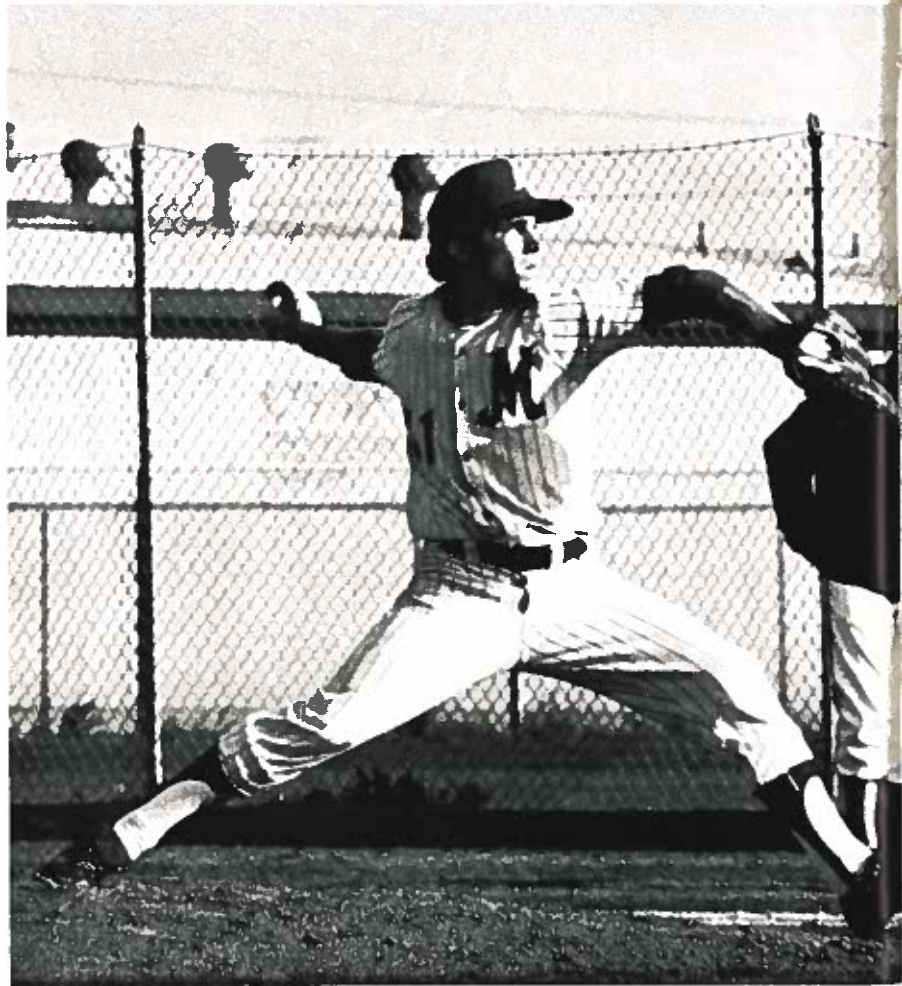

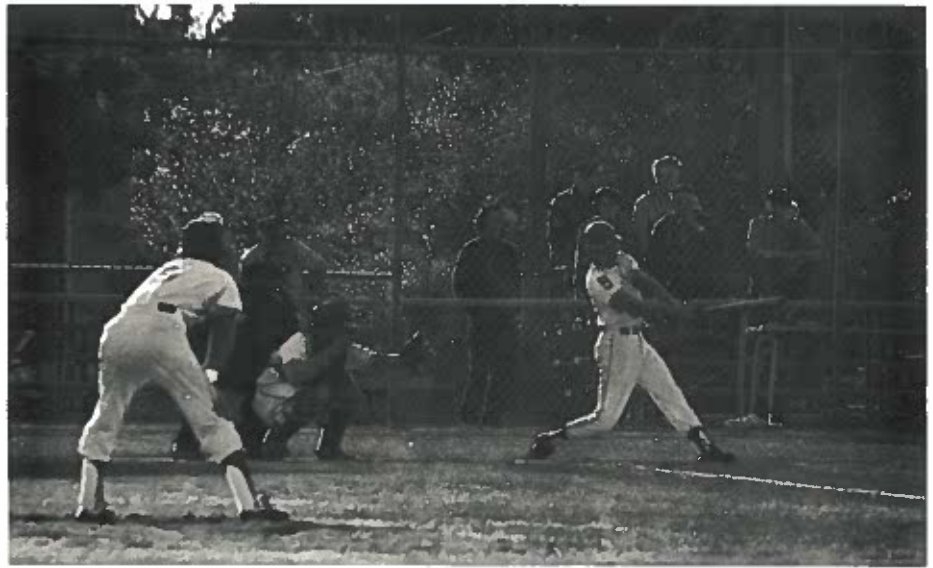

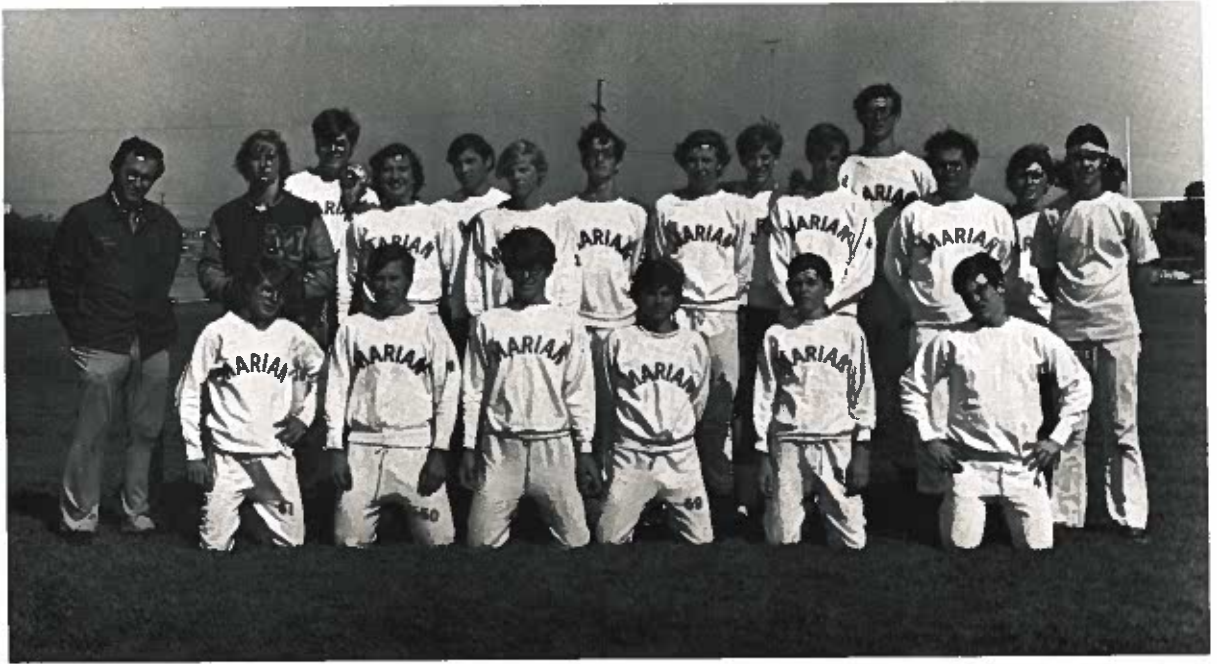

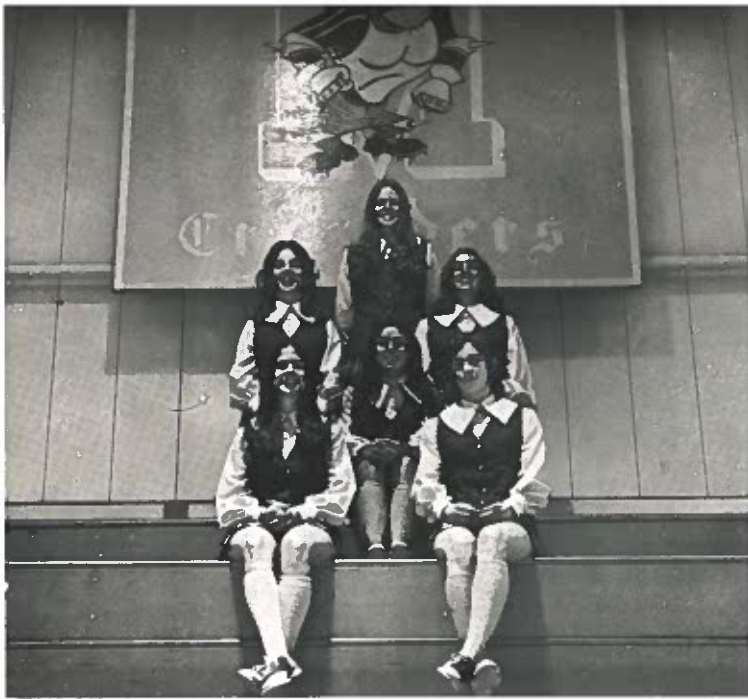

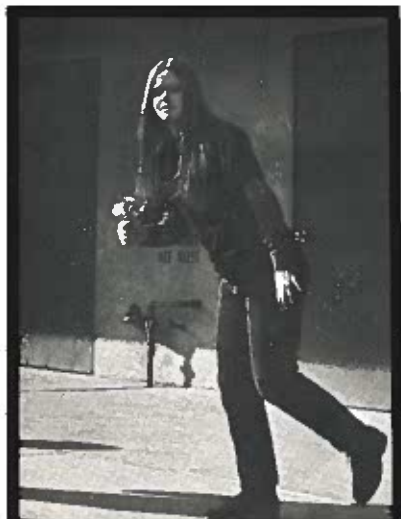
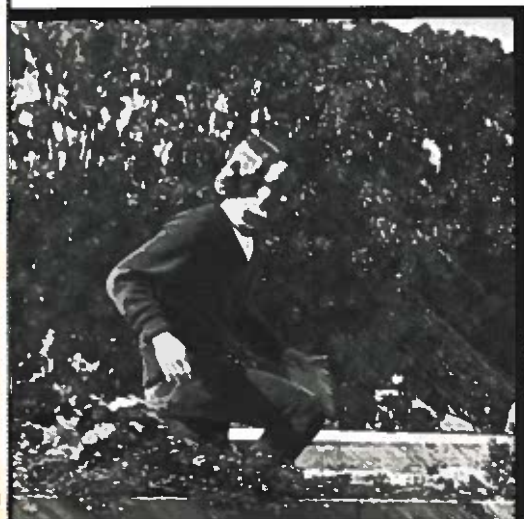
# SLAVE SALE

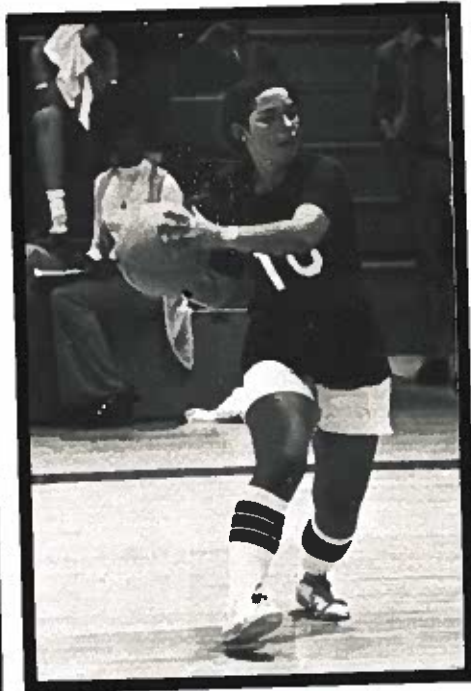

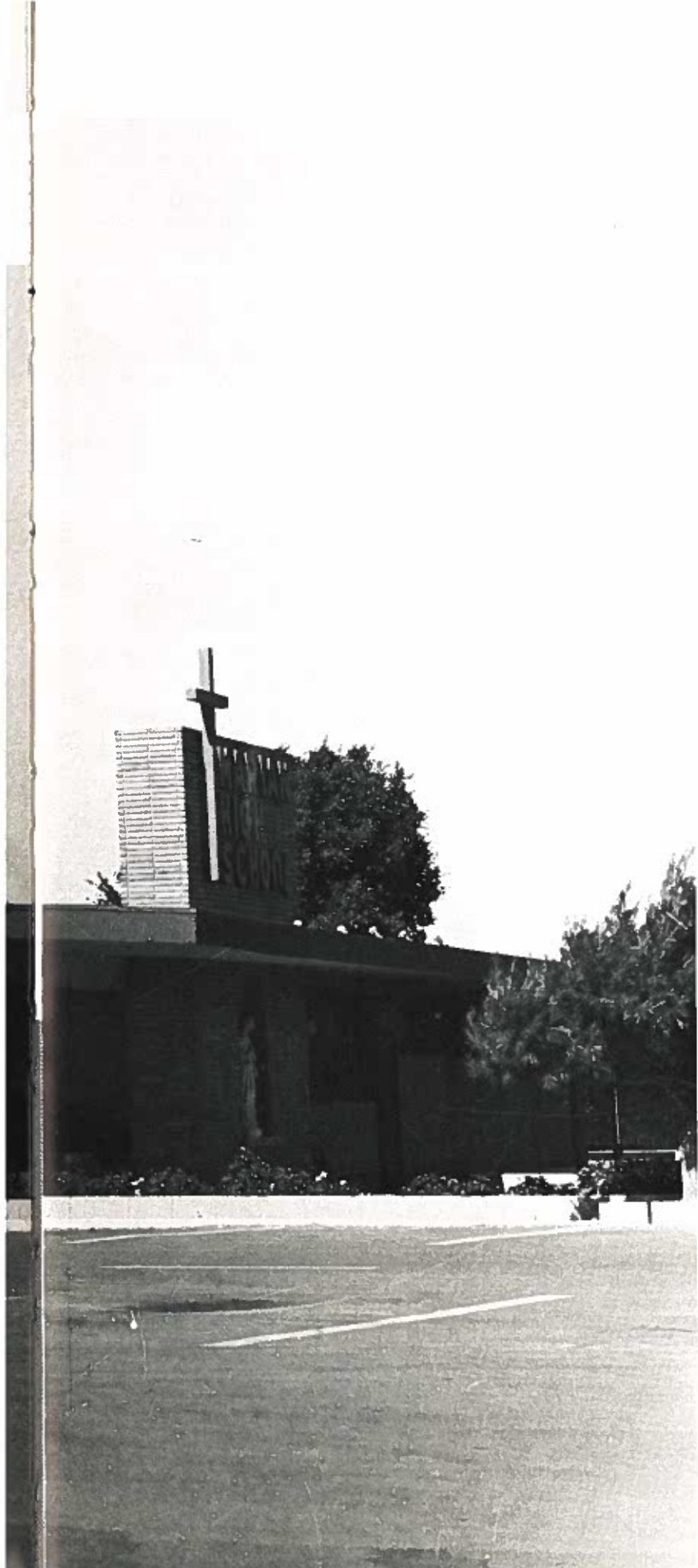
